

# Political Parties

## \* Political parties.

A group of ~~particular~~ people who came together to contest elections and hold power in government.

## \* functions of political parties.

- 1) Contest elections.
- 2) Put forward different policies and programmes.
- 3) Play a decisive role in law making.
- 4) forms and Runs the government.
- 5) Opposition parties voice different views and criticise government for wrong policies.
- 6) Shape public opinion.



## Party System

### 1) ONE Party System.

One party controls and Run the government.

ex: China.

Advantage :

quick decision making.

Disadvantage :

- i) Vulnerable to dictatorship,
- ii) Against the democracy.

### 2) Two-Party system.

Only the two main parties have serious chances of winning.

eg) U.S.A, U.K etc.

Advantage

more stable.

Disadvantage

Minorities may left Behind.

### 3) Multi Party System.

Several parties compete for power and all of them have reasonable chance of forming government.

ex) India.

#### Advantage:

fair choice, Democratic.

#### disadvantage

Political Instability.

## NATIONAL PARTIES

### Requirements.

- 6% votes of total votes in Lok Sabha or assembly election of 4 states.
- At least 4 seats in Lok Sabha.
- Office + Permanent symbol, etc.. .
- Known as 'Recognised Party'.

## State Parties

### Requirements.

- 6% of total votes in an election of a state legislative assembly.

- At least 2 seats in legislative Assembly.
- Known as 'Regional Party'.

#### \* Challenges faced by political parties:

- 1) Lack of internal democracy ... power lies with few leaders at top.
- 2) Top position of parties controlled by one family.
- 3) Parties nominate candidates who can raise a lot of money, sometimes even criminals.
- 4) Parties do not offer meaningful choice to voters, there's very less ideological difference between them.

#### \* Steps taken to Reform Political Parties:

- 1) Constitution prevents MPs, MLAs from changing parties because many representatives were indulging in defection to become minister or for cash rewards. Now if they do this they lose their seats.
- 2) Candidate contesting for election must file an affidavit giving details of their property.
- 3) Election commission has passed an order making it compulsory for parties to hold their organisation elections and file ITR (Income Tax Returns).

## Suggestion from us.

- 1) Laws should be made to regulate internal affairs of political parties from an independent authorities that solve party disputes.
- 2) 1/3rd tickets of women and 1/3rd top post of parties must be reserved for women.
- 3) Government should fund these parties to fight elections, funding must be based on no. of votes secured in last elections.
