Q.What is said in the prayer of St Francis of Assisi?

Answer:-In the prayer of St Francis of Assisi, which Mother Teresa mentions in her speech, the Saint seeks inspiration from God so that peace and love prevail and the wrong doings are nullified. Hope, Light, and Joy are invoked to cure shadows and sadness. The prayer talks about making others comfortable rather than seeking comfort. That is why, in the prayer St Francis wants to understand others more than to be understood. He wants to love more than to be loved.

Q.What, according to Mother Teresa, is needed to overcome the evils of the world?

Answer:-According to Mother Teresa, the only thing that can overcome the evils of the world is Love. This love can begin at home and radiate everywhere. Love brings peace and peace can make possible the presence of God in the family. Each would be tied to the other by the bondage of love. If love is put into action, people would start serving other people and that would be the greatest way to serve God. If mutual feeling of love and compassion can be developed in this way, it would surely reduce hatred and misery. People would feel that they are wanted and they are loved and this would keep smile intact in their face even in their death bed.

Q.Why does Mother Teresa believe that it is not enough for us to say "I love God but I do not love my Neighbour"?

Answer:-Mother Teresa firmly believes in the Christian doctrine "Love thy Neighbour". She argues that it is not possible to love God whom nobody can see if one is incapable of loving neighbours whom one always sees. So it is important for a person to love neighbours if one is to serve God. Jesus Christ loved human beings and Christianity says that that human should love as Jesus loved. So, loving mankind is the key to loving God. Complete and true love for God would invariably lead one to love those who are naked, orphaned, sick, homeless or somehow in misery and are living around us.

Q.What is Mother Teresa's conception of God? Why does Mother Teresa say that her life and the lives of their sisters have to be woven with prayer?

Answer:-According to Mother Teresa, God is Almighty and He has carved everything including humans with His own hand. God is infinite but loves all His creation and loves them to the point of getting hurt. He is a continuous judge of our activities and evaluates how much love we put in for our neighbours as they are the embodiment of the living God.

According to Mother Teresa, those who are in service of Christ have to relive the passion of the Lord which is to share the sufferings of the others. So the spirit of oneself is to be woven with the spirit of Christ to understand human problems. That is why she feels that her life and the lives of her sisters have to be woven with prayer.

Q.Why does Mother Teresa compare the poor people with angels?

Answer:-Mother Teresa, in her thanksgiving lecture after receiving the Nobel Peace Prize, states that the poor people are great as they suffer the miseries of hunger, pain, cold and death without complaining about them. This makes the Mother admire poor people who cheerfully die thanking the person who somehow cares for him. Mother Teresa points out to the wonderful sense of gratitude of a dying lady whom he once picked up from the road. So the poor and the destitute have much to teach us, having such wonderful angelic disposition. So she compares poor people with angels.

Q.What story of neighbourly love does Mother Teresa narrate in her speech?

Answer:-Mother Teresa narrates that once a gentleman informed her of a starving Hindu family of eight children and requested her to do something for them. Mother went to the household with some rice and could see the hunger in the faces of the children. The Hindu mother distributed some rice among her children and went away with some rice. When she returned and Mother Teresa asked her where she had been, the mother of eight children answered that she had gone to give some rice to a Muslim household which also had been starving for some time. Mother Teresa was deeply moved by this gesture of neighbourly love.

Q.What does Mother Teresa say about the greatest destroyer of peace? How successful she has been in her fight against this?

Answer:-According to the Mother, the greatest destroyer of peace in the world is abortion as it is the direct killing of the unwanted unborn child by the will of the mother. It amounts to going against the will of God who made the child wanted while the mother did not want so. In a society where else can one find peace of it is not in the lap of the mother?

Mother Teresa and her organisation have achieved success in this fight against abortion by teaching the poor and the destitute natural ways of family planning. In her aim to make the unwanted children wanted she urged mothers to give birth to the babies and give them to her so that she could make the baby feel wanted in a family of a childless couple.

Q.How does Mother Teresa describe the plight of the elderly people in the old age homes?

Answer:-According to Mother Teresa, the elderly people lead a miserable life in the old age homes in spite of having all the conveniences as they live and fight with the truth that they have been forgotten by their sons and daughters who fail to manage time to come and meet them. These people seldom laugh and wait endlessly looking at the door for their sons and daughters. This is very much in contrast with those miserable and dying people in Mother's Homes who never fail to smile as they have the feeling that they are loved and cared for. They feel at home in spite of not having any relatives by their side.
